## REPORT.

THE Committee of the CANADA EAST DISTRICT AUXILIARY MISSIONARY SOCIETY have great pleasure in again presenting their Annual Report of the proceedings of the Wesleyan Missionary Society for the past year.

The following is the Financial Statement, as read at the late meeting of the Parent Society in May last:

On this statement the following remarks are respectfully offered. If the Income of the year be examined, it will be found that there is an increase on the whole of £2,838 13s. 8d., and that this advance has arisen from an increase in every general source of Income. The increase on the Home Receipts is £2,067 15s. 9d. The following are the particulars. The Receipts from the Home Auxiliaries, including the Contributions received at the Mission-House, amount to £82,950 7s. 5d., and show an Increase of £1,515 1s. 11d. The Juvenile Christmas and New Year's Offerings amount to £4,770 19s. 8d., being an increase in this delightful source of Income of £284 10s. 3d. The Receipts from Ireland have been £6,462 5s. 10d., showing an Increase of £262 3s. The Receipts from Foreign Auxiliaries on the Mission Stations are £11,788 6s. 5d., being an Increase of £114 1s. 10d.; and the Miscellaneous Receipts in the form of Colonial Grants, Legacies, Dividends, New Donations on Annuity for Life, &c., have amounted to £9,790 3s. 10d. being an Increase of £656 16s. 1d. on this item for the year.
