BARTHOU DEFEAT FOLLOWED BY RESIGNATION

French Ministry Maintained That Big New Loan Should Not Be Taxed and Vote Showed Opponents in Majority — Grave Financial Situation is the Outcome.

PARIS, Dec. 2.—(Can. Press.)—Premier Barthou was defeated, 390 to 265, in the chamber of deputies this afternoon on the question of whether the new loan of \$200,000,000 should be subject to taxation or immune, like the existing rentes.

As soon as the vote placing the government in the minority by 25 was read, the ministers left the chamber in a body and proceeded to Elysee Palace, where they handed their resignations to President Poincaré.

The ministry, headed by J. Louis Barthou, after a long and vigorous defence, fell as the result of the combined attacks of the recently reorganized Radicals, under ex-Premier Callaoux and the Socialists, led by M. Jaurès. The government by a narrow margin yesterday, was victorious in a trial of strength against the opposition, the new loan being approved by a vote of 291 to 270.

The debate today was on the question of extending to the new loan the same immunity from taxation as enjoyed by the old rentes and the government again made it a question of a vote of confidence. The opposition urged that to exempt the new rentes would enable those investing exclusively in these to evade unfairly the projected income tax.

Premier Barthou and M. Dumont, the minister of finance, made eloquent appeals to the chamber to respect the traditional immunity of the rentes. To tax rentes, they declared, would deal a deadly blow to the financial prestige of France. But their appeals fell on deaf ears. The sitting grew more uproarious, and frequently the president rang his bell in vain attempt to obtain order. The result of the vote was greeted with wild cheering by the members of the opposition, while the government forces appeared greatly depressed.

All the parties agree that the ministerial crisis precipitated by the vote in the chamber creates a situation of exceptional gravity. The first immediate consequence is indefinitely to postpone the issue of the loan, which the necessity to meet the extraordinary military expenditure makes indispensable. It is also generally feared that the prospect of a tax on rentes will seriously affect the market.

Western Grain Growers Have Received Ninety Millions Cash

WINNIPEG, Dec. 2.—(Can. Press.)—Figures obtainable at the Winnipeg Grain Exchange show that up to Dec. 1 the farmers of Western Canada marketed 143,000,000 bushels of grain, for which they received in actual cash \$90,000,000.

This is the greatest movement ever known, and it is but part of the story of western prosperity, for the grain is coming along more rapidly than ever and there is no sign of abatement. The excellent weather makes conditions ideal for shipment. Yesterday every record in the history of the local grain exchange went by the board when a total of 1873 cars of all kinds of grain was inspected in Winnipeg. Today there were 1266 cars in sight.

CANADIAN STEER IS CHAMPION OF BIGGEST LIVE STOCK SHOW

J. D. McGregor of Brandon Won Sweepstakes Grand Championship at Chicago for Second Time With Glenarnock Victor II.

CHICAGO, Dec. 2.—(Can. Press.)—J. D. McGregor of Brandon, Man., has pulled off the grand championship of the International Live Stock Show of Chicago, the biggest show of its kind on earth.

Glenarnock Victor II, his downed all comers in the steer classes, and there were scores of them. He was first in his class as a grade yearling, then champion of all grades and cross-breeds, and then champion of all yearlings, and finally grand champion over all pure breeds and grades. He was bred by J. D. McGregor, his sire was Golden Gleam, and he is out of the same dam as last year's grand champion. His grand-dam was an ordinary red nurse cow. He has been fed on nothing that cannot be grown on any Canadian farm—barley and oat chop, turnips, old sheaves, prairie hay and a very little linseed meal. He would not know corn if he met it.

The greatest triumph of all, he was fed by young Harry Bowman, a boy not yet 17, who has no special training as a feeder, but he has cared for this calf from birth, and Mr. McGregor would not allow him to be interfered with by any of his older and more experienced feeders.

Twice in Succession.

It is the first time in the history of the International that the sweepstakes grand championship of the show has been won twice in succession by an individual breeder. Once previously Ames College won two years in succession. It is the third time the championship has come to Canada. In addition to this win, J. D. McGregor also won this morning first place in the class, three steers out of one sire. These steers were

GENERAL FLIGHT STARTS FROM JUAREZ

Hundreds of Men, Women and Children Are Leaving the City, While Poor and Wealthy Alike Face Starvation — Rebels Report Many More Victories.

JUAREZ, Dec. 2.—(Can. Press.)—Reports received today from Villa Ahumada, stated that hundreds of men, women and children were fleeing across the desert from Chihuahua to Ojinaga and other border points. Long wagon trains, horses and burros, laden with household goods and valuables, and followed by a scurrying horde of people on foot, were seen.

It appears as though almost the whole city, carrying its richest possessions, had been set in motion suddenly and was struggling thru clouds of dust to keep pace with a hurrying escort of federals, according to the rebel scouts.

Members of the wealthy Terrazas and Creel families, whose lives were threatened by the projected rebel attack on Chihuahua. These families, some of whom were heads of banking institutions, had been isolated in Chihuahua for many weeks.

The reports brought to Gen. Villa were that food supplies were so scant that not only the poor, but the wealthy faced starvation and that finally these representations induced the federal to evacuate.

Villa sent couriers south today to learn whether Gen. Chao, the Constitutional, had entered the city. Villa said he did not regard the evacuation of Chihuahua as a complete surrender of federal authority, but rather that the federal troops had decided to adopt guerrilla tactics after replenishing their supplies and communicating with Mexico City.

WILL OPEN UP VAST RESOURCES

U. S. Government Will Build a Railway in Alaska in Order to Reach the Interior.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 2.—(Can. Press.)—The Alaskan railway bill, recently reported to the house committee on territories, will be called up in the house tomorrow in an effort to secure its passage in the near future. The bill proposes to have the government build a railway to connect the southern coast of Alaska with the interior to open up the vast resources of the territory.

The president's recommendation to congress today that Alaskan railway legislation be expedited was followed by a conference between Democratic Leader Underwood and Chairman Houston of the territories, at which it was decided to seek quick action.

RAILWAYS TO BE PARALYZED

Cutting Off of Fuel Supply by Oil Companies Staggering Blow to Mexican Government.

MEXICO CITY, Dec. 2.—(Can. Press.)—Preferring to incur the displeasure of the Huerta government to a very practical manifestation of the rebels' wrath, the producing oil companies of the republic today canceled their contracts for supplying the National Railways with fuel oil.

This is regarded as one of the most serious blows dealt the government, because it is likely to bring about early suspension of railway traffic, which would interfere greatly with military operations and would strike vitally at the commerce of the country.

Most of the oil used by the railways is produced in the coast region of Tampico and southward.

This territory is overrun with rebels, directed for the most part by Gen. Candido Aguilar.

THIRTEEN HOURS' DAILY SITTING UNTIL CURRENCY BILL PASSES

Such is Apparently Program of Democratic Majority in Senate Despite Protests of Aggrieved Republicans, Who Maintain Endurance Test Will Prevent Intelligent Consideration.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 2.—(Can. Press.)—Without formal action the Democrats of the senate today put in operation the drastic program they have adopted for the consideration of the administration currency bill. The Republicans, after a two hours' debate, prevented a vote on a motion calling for continuous sessions of the senate daily from 10 o'clock in the morning until 11 o'clock at night with a two-hour dinner recess, but the majority pressed the bill forward at every opportunity and kept the senate in session tonight.

When Senator Kern presented a resolution which would have bound the senate to the proposition to sit thirteen hours a day the Republicans made a vigorous protest, declaring that such action was unnecessary and would prevent intelligent consideration of the bill. Senator Norris tried to secure an agreement for shorter daily sessions with an agreement to vote on the bill by Dec. 20 but this was defeated. The Kern resolution went over until tomorrow.

The action of the Republicans followed a minority caucus, which decided to offer formal protest against the Democratic program, but agreed to make no concerted effort to prevent speedy consideration of the currency bill.

PLAYGROUNDS OPEN SUNDAYS MAY BE THE RULE IN TORONTO

Some Form of Reasonable Recreation is Needed for Children in Congested Districts Who Do Not Go to Sunday School — Announcement Made by Mrs. Huestia.

Sunday playgrounds for Toronto are coming into view. An intimation to that effect, given at the Fred Victor Mission last night to an audience largely composed of devout young Methodist students, was heard with evident approval. Mrs. A. M. Huestia stated that something in the line of reasonable recreation for the children of the downtown section for Sundays was being thought out.

Judged by their fruits supervised playgrounds were a success as a means of preventing juvenile delinquency and giving an uplift to ambitious and well-intentioned children.

In the rapid growth of many Canadian cities the field of today was the city-square of tomorrow, and it was of vital importance that adequate provision for playgrounds should be made. In Toronto the supervised playgrounds had perceptibly reduced the proportion of juvenile delinquents in the board of correction.

Miss J. Smith of the College street public library gave an account of the children's department.

One of the difficulties was that Saturday being the Jewish Sabbath militated against orthodox Hebrew children having the full advantage of the department.

CRISIS IS NEAR GENERAL BELIEF

Huerta's Position More Precarious Than Was That of Diaz Before Downfall.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 2.—(Canadian Press.)—The state department today continued in its attitude of watchful attention to the development of the plans of campaign of the Mexican insurgent leaders. It was pointed out in official circles that at the present moment the constitutional party appears to be in actual possession of more country and to have more numerous armies in the field than did Madero when he received notice of the overthrow of Porfirio Diaz as president of Mexico. Consequently there is a general belief here that a crisis has almost been reached.

Meanwhile the American Government is giving attention to the cases of individual Americans who are reported to be in trouble in Western Mexico, and also is concerning itself with the protection of life and property in the oil fields of the State of Vera Cruz. Rear-Admiral Fletcher is keeping the state department closely advised of the situation in that quarter.

CONGRESS FAVOR NAVAL HOLIDAY PROPOSALS

Passage of Resolution Committing United States to Winston Churchill's Plan Seems Definitely Assured — Would Mean Saving of Fifty Millions by U. S. in Year.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 2.—(Canadian Press.)—The house for hours today debated the Hensley resolution to commit the United States to the Winston Churchill plan for an international year's holiday in naval construction, and tonight the advocates of the project predicted passage of the resolution in the house by Friday. Consideration of the matter will be resumed Thursday, with both sides, the advocates fear outnumbering the opponents, prepared to continue the debate.

The idea of suspending naval construction for a year, first proposed to the British Parliament by the first lord of the admiralty, has since been commended by leaders of all parties in the American congress. Representative Henney of Missouri, author of the measure, in urging its adoption, pointed out that only two per cent of the United States revenues is devoted to the benefit of agriculture, while 60 per cent goes to defray the cost of the past wars and to prepare for future wars. He declared that all over the country there was going up the cry of the high cost of living, while enormous expenditures were being made for military and naval purposes.

Representative Foster of Illinois said the time had come when the United States should take the lead of all the world nations in the movement for peace, to lift the burdens from the people and to leave the settlement of differences to arbitration.

A Huge Saving.

Representative Decker of Missouri declared that the United States built battleships "because, forsooth, our neighbors build them." He suggested that a year's naval holiday might be extended indefinitely.

Representative Hobson of Alabama said he preferred the upbuilding of an Atlantic fleet as a means of attaining a world equilibrium and an assurance of peace.

Representative Barthold of Missouri pointed out that with an international agreement for a year's naval holiday the relative strength at the end of the year would be the same among nations and that meanwhile the United States would save \$50,000,000. Great Britain \$60,000,000 and Germany \$20,000,000.

READY TO TALK ON HOME RULE

Speeches by British Ministers Show That Asquith Has Not Closed Door to Negotiations.

LONDON, Dec. 2.—(Can. Press.)—The anxiety of the government to bring about if possible a settlement of the home rule question by consent is shown by the character of the speeches of different members of the ministry tonight. Viscount Haldane, lord high chancellor, dilating at Birmingham on the importance of reaching such a settlement, made an appeal for one or more responsible men from each side to meet and talk together with unrestrained freedom, "which would be only possible in private conference."

The Right Hon. Herbert Samuel, postmaster-general, "Sir John A. Simon, attorney-general, and the Right Hon. J. A. Pease, president of the board of education, speaking at other places, voiced similar sentiments and emphasized the fact that Premier Asquith had not closed the door to negotiation.

WAITING MAY BE DISASTROUS

London Times Believes Desperate Situation is Developing in Mexico Because of U.S. Attitude.

LONDON, Dec. 2.—(Can. Press.)—The Times, which is devoting great attention to the Mexican situation, is publishing a fresh series of despatches from Mexico City calling serious attention to "the desperate situation developing in consequence of the attitude of the United States," and declaring that if the American tactics of "watchful waiting" continue to be pursued "there are no words too strong to paint the disastrous results which will ensue."

In an editorial on these despatches and President Wilson's message The Times says: "We are convinced that these dangers are realized as fully at Washington as at Mexico City. Presidents, like other rulers, are not given to betraying the secrets of their policy in public utterances. We shall be surprised if, when General Huerta is got rid of, President Wilson is not found to have thought out and to be ready to apply a plan for restoring order and decent government in Mexico."

The other London morning papers note and commend the brevity of the president's message. The Standard and Daily Graphic has no reason to doubt that the president's policy will achieve the initial success of removing Huerta.
