Qualifications

4. Any white male person over the full age of eighteen membership, years may, subject to the terms of the duly enacted bylaws of the Association from time to time in effect, become a member of the Association, provided that the Association shall, upon the acquisition of the affairs of the Letters Patent Association mentioned in the next following section, admit all persons who are at the time of such acquisition members in good standing of the said Letters Patent Association as then constituted.

of the Association. **5.** (1) The Association shall have power:

10 (a) To organize, establish and carry on local branches of the Association, which branches shall be called "clubs".

(b) To propagate and develop among the members of the Association, a spirit of mutual co-operation, 15

assistance, and friendship.

(c) To advance and protect the interests of all commercial travellers, and in particular, the members of the Association, and for such purpose to negotiate agreements and co-operate with any government, corpor- 20 ation, society, person or persons, whenever such agreements and co-operation may be calculated either directly or indirectly to assist or promote the welfare or convenience of commercial travellers.

(d) To establish insurance benefit funds as follows: (i) A fund for providing death benefits and endowment benefits within the powers in that behalf conferred on fraternal benefit societies under The Canadian

and British Insurance Companies Act 1932; and

(ii) A personal accident and sickness fund for 30 providing benefits in the event of death from any cause whatever, or of injury by accident, of a member, and for providing indemnity during the incapacity of a member arising out of accident or sickness.

(2) Subject to sections thirteen and fourteen of this Act, 35 the Association may acquire the whole or any part of the rights and property, and may assume the obligations and the liabilities of the Associated Canadian Travellers, a
