nize the things that abide. The Church must see to it that nothing hostile to the Spirit, which gives it iife is retained in its organization, that no surplus baggage of creed or form is allowed to hamper it in its facing the Crisis which is upon us. That this may be, the College will seek to stand as interpreter of social conditions to its constituency.

THE GREAT NEED OF THE CHURCH.

The great need of the Church as of the world is a higher God consciousness bom of feilowship in Jesus Christ. To move forward is to get into deeper sympathy with Him, to bring His Spirit into all our lives. And it is coming. Over the whole world a new spirit of earnestness is becoming manifest. That tragic brotherhood of crosses on a thousand bloody battle fields calls for a brotherhood of living men about the Cross. And the humanity that recruited so many of her bravest and best sons and daughters to die for Justice to the weak and oppressed in international relations will not be deaf to the new call for men and women to live for Justice to all men in social relations.

We are hungry for Peace, but Peace can only come and remain when Justice is done, when every human being has a fair chance for a full orbed life.

The first line of Peace Makers were the soldiers who fought for liberty and justice without which there can be no peace.
