As compared with other Churches, the amount annually subscribed by members of the Church of England in this Diocese for religious purposes, is small. This has unquestionably originated, in part at least, from many conscientiously withholding their contributions from work which they could not view as soundly Evangelical and Protestant. Now, however, that all Evangelical Protestant Churchmen have the opportunity afforded to them of co-operating in the work of their own Church, in full accordance with their principles, it is carnestly hoped that such a manifestation of Christian liberality will result, as shall suffice to remove the stigma of grudging and inadequate response to the claims of Christ and His Church.

The true practical evidence that Evangelical Churchmen are in carnest, will be best furnished by the hearty response in the form of contributions to the above Church schemes of not less than \$10,000 per annum.
