"For the last five months it has required an enormous amount of food to feed 100,000 men. That seems a low estimate to you, perhaps, as the forces now in the field are double that number, but it is about correct for the dally average since the war commenced and will do as a basis of calculation. To feed 100,000 stomachs it takes 500 tons of food per day, and it is essential that the full supply is on hand, because a reduction of the rations ensures a like reduction in the fighting value of a soldier. For five months, or 157 days, on which we are figuring, it took no less than 78,500 tons to relieve our soldiers' appetites.

"Have you any idea of the extent of this meal? Well, if it all had to be transported at once it would take a whole fleet of 78 blg transports, each with a capacity of 1600 tons, which, if formed in a single column, would make a line of seven and one-half miles, and their combined ton-age would aggregate 795,600. When the ships discharged their cargoes it would take a train of 39,250 cars, making a continuous line of 375 miles, to remove the food to the interior.
