

Two mounted Ausventinas were captured. Some of the Rouxv lie mor-chants have destroyed the Rouxv lie mor-vent them from failing into the hands of the Boers.

Gen. Buller at Work. Lydenburg, Tuesday, Oct. 2.-Gen. Bull-er's force has been pursuing the Boers thru Pilgrim's Rest and Krugersport. He is now near Ohrigstadt, and is still marching northward. The Boers now here have made a stand.

Boers Retreated With Guns. London, Oct. 7.-It is estimated, accord-ing to the Pietermaritzburg correspondent of The Daily Mail, that from 4000 to 5000 Boers have retreated from Pilgrim's Rest, northeast of Lydenburg, with four iong toms and twenty-two other guns. The cor-respondent understands that their long tom ammunition is almost exhausted.
