





It is known, however, that Tolstoi has been in Ill-health ever since his excommunication, a year ago, and constant reports have said that the great Russian was slowly pining way. In fact, occasional correspondents have declared that the ac-tion of the Holy Synod in placing him within the ban was directly responsible for his feedbleness, and would ultimately be responsible for his death.
