

J. J. D. Q.—Can a young man of 22 years without category be examined any day, or must he wait until called?

MAY BAN DELEGATIONS A.—He cannot be examined unless he wishes to report for service. He can report before being notified, or wait till notified he wishes.

Changes in Present System A. L. R. Q.—Is there a military school of massage in Toronto or elsewhere? A.—Write to the assistant adjutant-general of Military District No. 2, To-conto. None are known of elsewhere.

G. B. S. Q.—1. I am an A2 man ordered to report for service. I have a brother just returned from the front badly wounded, and a sister a trained nurse who has been in France for two years, also another brother at home, who is in category E. Have I any chance to obtain an E. Have I any chance to obtain an extension leave to enable me to complete the course I am taking?

2. If not, can I by going to London a few days ahead of time Join the Tank Battallon?

A.—1. You may be able to secure a leave of absence by applying to your officer commanding when you report for 2. No more recruits are being taken here for the Tank Battalion.

J. W. H. Q.—Can a married man, who is unfit for military service, cross to the United States? Can a woman cross the line on a visit without permission? A .- The man would need passports,

and the woman would be wise to get them also. Write to John Riggs, Do-minion Immigration Office, Carling Block, London, Ont.

C. L. Q.—I was placed in category A2 and exempted. I am on my own farm and was 22 years old and single when I received exemption. I was married in January, 1918. Would I come in the first draft of the unmarried men between the ages of 20 and 22?

A.—Yes; though you may secure furough until June 1 for farming.

J. S. N. Q.—Would a young man of 24 years, unmarried, owning and working alone a farm of 320 acres in the West, be called in the first draft? Or will he be called at all? He has been exempted for farming, and has no brothers in the war. A.—He will not be called at present, as he is over the age of 23. Should the exemptions of men of his age be cancelled, he would then be called, and if fit, would be required to serve.

A. A. R. Q.—Would a man aged 32 and exempted come in the third draft if he were married on May 1, 1918?

A.—No; he would still be a member of class one, for all men married after July 6, 1917, are considered unmarried for purposes of classification.

F. B. L. Q.—I am a railroad man and got exempted. I have received notice to report in May. I am the main support of my father and mother, who are not able to work. Could I claim exemption? If not, could I claim the patriotic fund or the separation allowance for my parents?

A.—If you were 20 and had not attained the age of 23 when you claimed exemption last fall, and if you are in category A, you cannot get exemption. You might get leave if you have other members of your family in the service at the front. Any soldier who can prove that he was the sole support of his mother can secure separation allowance. He would also be able to secure the aid of the patriotic fund, if needed.
