

**Melville, Crang
and Welton Win
High School Run**

At the first annual cross-country race of the Northwest High School yesterday afternoon, there were 23 competitors, 11 juniors, 4 intermediates and 6 seniors.

Owing to the snow the going was slippery and the time slower than anticipated. The course started at the C.P.R. and Balmurst, up over the hill and cross country to St. Clair and Spadina-road, then up a half mile and again across the fields to Wychwood and Vaughan-road. Here the juniors were sent the cross-cut home down the Vaughan-road to finish at the starting point. The seniors and intermediates

kept on down Wychwood, cross to St. Clair and then over the old plank road to Bathurst-street and the railway. The finishers in the three divisions were as follows:

Seniors—L. Melville 1, F. Dent 2, G. Pinkerton 3. Time 25 minutes. The other starters were Robertson, McEachern and Ricketts.

Intermediate—Craig 1, G. Moffitt 2, Brown 3, Hilley 4. Time 25 minutes.

Juniors—K. Welton 1, McKenney 2.
