King Olympian, Second Choice, Captures Pocantico Stakes in Two Horse Race.

BELMONT PARK, May 25.—The card at Belmont Park to-day was very ordinary, owing to the fact that the different events were greatly reduced by scratches.

The Pocantico Stakes for three-year-olds had only two starters out of six entered.

King Olympian led the front at the start and satio Dugan rode Candeberry hard all the way, he was beaten half a length.

Ballot, who raced in England last year, made his first appearance and was the first choice for the Pocantico Handicap to be run next Tuesday at Gravesend.

He was hard to beat, but won by a good length. He was given a routing cheer as he flashed under the wire.
