JEWS AND GENTILES

DIFFER IN METHOD

International bakers in Toronto are presenting the new agreement to the voters shortly. An interesting note in connection with the agreement is given in the present issue of the Jewish Journal. The latter asks for a minimum wage of \$18 and a maximum of \$35 a week, with \$20 a week for apprentices. The Jewish union agreement calls for a general wage of \$20 a week, but its scale is lower than that of the Jewish journeymen bakers. The Jewish union, too, is asking for \$10 a day for overtime while the other is calling for only \$5 a day.

THREE LAY DEAD

SINCE MARCH 3

Landlord Finds Decomposed Corpses of Tenants—
Gas Jet On.

The decomposed bodies of two men and one woman were found in a room over a Chinese laundry at 335 West King street yesterday afternoon. The bodies were those of John Callicott, his wife, Mary, and M. Johnston, who had been living with them. Death was from gas poisoning, and as far as can be learned by the police the bodies had been lying in the room since March 3. An investigation by the police showed that liquor had been consumed in the room, as a number of empty bottles were found lying on the floor. The police are of the opinion that the gas jet of a small stove had been accidentally left turned on.

Mr. and Mrs. Callicott, whose bodies were identified at the morgue by Charles Callicott, 231 Christie street, a brother of the dead man, were 35 years of age. Mr. Johnston is believed to have relatives in Niagara Falls. Amongst his personal belongings the police found several pay envelopes, showing he had been in the employ of the Hydro-Electric Company. He also had a book of tickets issued on February 25 by the Niagara Falls radial line.

Charles Callicott stated that the last time he had seen his brother alive was about ten days ago. Slacker Jacob, 369 West King street, owner of the building, discovered the bodies when he called to see if his tenants had moved.

Thought They Had Left.

On entering the laundry office of Lee Long, Jacob asked if the people upstairs had moved. Long told him he thought they had left a week ago, as he had not seen or heard of them. Walking to the flat above, Jacob found the door locked, and lifting the letter box detected the odor of gas. He called Policeman Cummings, and after turning the gas off at the meter downstairs, Cummings broke open the door and found the dead bodies. All three were fully dressed. Mrs. Callicott was lying in bed, while Johnston's body was found lying on a camp bed in the same room.

Examining the fixtures connected to the small gas stove, the police found that the jet to the stove had been turned fully on. The room was filled with gas fumes, and the bodies were distended and blackened. Mrs. Callicott at one time lived near Peterboro. Her husband was the manufacturer of an automatic air vent.

The police notified Chief Coroner A. J. Johnson, of the affair, and removed the bodies to the morgue. It has not yet been decided as to whether or not an inquest will be held.

Victor Dupuis of Montreal Found Guilty of Murder

Montreal, March 12.—Victor Dupuis this afternoon found guilty of the murder of Patrick Leahy and sentenced by Mr. Justice Desy to hang on June 18 next. The death sentence will, however, be accompanied by a strong recommendation to mercy.

CITY HALL NOTES

City Solicitor Johnston, acting under instructions, has beaten the city council to it, and in this week's Ontario Gazette, appears an advertisement of a civic bill whereby the legislature is asked to enable Toronto to issue debentures for the raising of \$943,000 for the proposed Mount Pleasant civic car line. Although \$1,000,000 is required for the purpose, as estimated by the works commissioner, the additional \$117,000 is already available. This amount remains from the money voted by the ratepayers some years ago for the general civic car line scheme for the entire city. If the council rejects the new proposal, this application will be withdrawn.

The board adopted the mayor's motion to instruct the works commissioner to get in touch with the chief engineer, requesting him to report on the matter of enabling a certain number of jitneys to operate in Toronto during the rush hours.

The civic works committee seems to be catching the popular spirit around the city hall and is rapidly developing the habit of referring back the majority of matters which confront them. When they met yesterday afternoon, no less than six communications received were relegated back for further consideration.

Mount Pleasant road was brought up again, but this time only in the form of a communication from the works and assessment commissioners, recommending the acquisition by the city of additional land whereby the road could be extended.

This extension is necessary on that section of the road near Mount Pleasant Cemetery, and it was suggested that the city buy 50 feet to the west of the road and 25 feet to the east. The cost of this purchase is included in the \$275,000 granted for the extension of Mount Pleasant road.

A petition of L. Reynolds and 400 residents of the locality, asking that the St. Clair avenue cars be run north and south on Lansdowne avenue, was referred back, to be dealt with by the transportation commissioner. This request also asked that a short stub line be run on St. Clair

The committee approved Works Commissioner Harris' recommendation regarding the widening and grading of Bloor street, from High Park avenue to Jane street, so as to give a varying width of from 35 to nearly 87 feet. The cost is estimated at \$185,000, of which the city as a whole will contribute \$128,750.

Commissioner Harris' recommendation as to the reconstruction and widening of the asphalt pavement on Avenue road was referred back for further consideration.

The same fate befell a similar recommendation for reconstruction and widening of Howard street asphalt pavement.

Ald. MacGregor headed a large deputation of Lansdowne avenue property owners, who asked that a lane between that thoroughfare and St. Charles avenue be widened from 10 to 14 feet. This matter was also referred back, this time to the assessment commissioner.

The alderman explained that the people wanted the lane widened in order that they could park automobiles there, instead of paying \$10 a month for garage accommodation.

NOT IN THIS COUNCIL.

Prominent members of the International Union of Boilermakers and Shipbuilders in Toronto, Midland, Welland and Bridgeburg, in an interview with The World yesterday afternoon, vigorously denied having affiliated with the Canadian Council of the Metal Trades Section of the American Federation of Labor.
