ON THE RIVER. The steamer May Queen, which runs on the Grand Lake route, arrived at In-diantown this morning about nine o'clock. She came down the river last evening, but got caught in fog in Grand Bay and anchored until this morning.

WIFE OF DISTINGUISHED CANADIAN OFFICER KILLED IN RUNAWAY IN QUEBEC. Quebec, Oct. 31—Mrs. A. E. Swift, wife of Lieutenant Colonel A. E. Swift, D. S. O., C. 2nd Battalion, C. P. F. France, was killed yesterday afternoon by a team runaway horse.

N. B. WOMEN'S INSTITUTE TO BE HERE FOR THREE DAYS. The fourth annual convention of the New Brunswick Women's Institute will open tomorrow morning in the Germain street church institute and will continue for three days.

EXTENDING CROWN STREET TO MECKLENBURG. The work in Crown street, which is being carried out with the labor of the jail gang will carry this street right through to Mecklenburg. At present it is not used much beyond Lester street, although it is open to the foot of Orange street, but, with the roadway provided to the foot of Mecklenburg it is believed that this level roadway will be found of great use for traffic in that part of the city as it will enable vehicles to avoid the steep grades now encountered on the other streets.

BOARD OF HEALTH TO CLOSE THIS HOUSE. Following the decision of the local Board of Health in respect to executing their authority in closing houses unfit for habitation, one house in the vicinity of the Marsh road will be closed today.

SUMMERSIDE MAN NEW CHIEF ON P. E. I. RAILWAY. Moncton, N. B., Oct. 31—T. B. Brady of Summerside has been appointed superintendent of the P. E. I. railway with offices in Charlottetown, succeeding H. McEwan.

GOVERNMENT NEEDS FULL USE OF THE RUSSIAN RAILWAYS. Petrograd, Oct. 31—The importation of goods for private use has been prohibited on account of traffic congestion. Special permission is required for shipments for other than government purposes.

BUILDING WORK IN CITY SHOWS A SUBSTANTIAL GAIN

Increase of 60 Per Cent Over Last Year - Three New Carleton Structures

The value of construction work undertaken in St. John during the part of the year which has passed shows an increase of sixty per cent, in comparison with the same period last year. Since January 1 the permits issued by Inspector James Carleton have totalled \$447,000, as compared with \$283,150 for the first ten months of 1915.

Some of the permits issued during the month were: Board of school trustees, brick school building, Bentley street, \$70,000. Frank Gerson, wooden shop and dwelling, corner Union and Window streets, West End, \$6,500.
