RUSSIA MOVING TO FORM LEAGUE WITH ASIATICS

Completing Treaties in West
To Allow Free Hand
In East

LONDON.—(United Press)—British students of international politics are viewing with some concern the trend of Russia's recent political alliances, aiming, it is believed here, at the eventual creation of some sort of Asiatic or semi-Asiatic League of Nations.

By a series of non-aggression pacts Russia has already made or is now attempting to effect between herself and Finland, Lithuania, Latvia, Poland, Yugoslavia and Rumania whereby Russia agrees not to attack them in return for their agreement neither to attack Russia nor permit the passage of foreign troops through their country in any action against Russia. British writers believe Russia is laying the groundwork for economic and political expansion to the South and East. With a solid line of countries along her western border pledged to neutrality, Russia, it is said, would be able to turn her attention to Asiatic politics with a free mind than would be possible with a horde of antagonistic neighbors along her 2,000 miles of European frontier. For this reason it is considered not improbable in some quarters that the Soviet may soon abandon its quarrel with Rumania over Bessarabia in return for

SECRET AGREEMENTS

But the Soviet diplomats have not waited for the consolidation of a complete line of neutral neighbors to the west before undertaking what is interpreted as their larger diplomatic aim the creation of a political and economic entente with the Asiatics and semi-Asiatics. Already secret agreements have been signed between Russia and Turkey, Russia and Persia and Russia and Afghanistan. According to the information given the press these treaties are purely in the nature of commercial agreements, but the exact text of the treaties is known only to the cabinets and diplomats of the governments involved, and it is suspected here that buried in the text are alliance clauses of high political importance.

It is an open secret in Chinese politics, and is blamed by British interests in China for four-fifths of the depression in British business in the Orient where for more than a year things have gradually been going from bad to worse. If the factors backed by Russia should come out victorious at the end of the Chinese conflict it is regarded as very probable that Russia would play upon Chinese dissatisfaction with certain phases of the League of Nations and urge her withdrawal. This effected, it is regarded as logical that Russia should invite China to join her 460,000,000 population with Russia's 180,000,000 and organize in the East a new league to offset the power of the League of Nations to the West. Turkey, a non-league nation would, it is surmised be invited to join as would also any dissatisfied Asiatic. It is noteworthy in this respect that the Chinese minister at Washington was recently reported to be in Angora con-

fering with the Turkish government concerning the prospective signing of a new Russo-Turkish agreement, the exact terms of which if in line with the Russo-Turkish agreement, would undoubtedly also be kept secret.

With Russia outspoken in its antagonism to "Capitalism" Europe on the West and China antagonistic to the power and growth of Japan on the East, the eventual merging of the two great nations between the leagues two territorial extremes, together with the countries bordering on the south who would come in as a matter of self-protection, is regarded here as a logical and not unnatural future development in world politics.

THRILLING "BATTLE" BY BRITISH NAVY

Series of Engagements Show
Power of Empire on the Sea

LONDON, Nov. 15.—The fight the other day in the North Sea, in which almost the whole fleet were engaged, produced a series of thrilling engagements which culminated in a torpedo attack by two flotillas of destroyers. The plan of operations was briefly: The battle cruiser squadron of the Blue Force—Hood, Repulse and Renown—sighted and pursued a weaker Red Force represented by the Second Battle Squadron—Revenge and Royal Sovereign. The Red Force fell back, fighting on its main fleet, represented by the Third Battle Squadron—Iron Duke, Marlborough, and Emperor of India. Upon sighting the Red main fleet the battle-cruisers endeavored to retire upon their own battle squadron. Repulse did not take part in the forefront of the battle, but met vicious attacks from cruisers and torpedo craft and covered the retirement with a high-speed destroyer attack.

It was a calm day, but Hood and Renown steamed at such speed that their bows were hidden by the steaming seas their funnels were awash when they appeared on the horizon and the boom of their 15-inch guns was heard.

Aircraft took part in the battle and they buzzed like hornets round the great bulk of Hood, diving again and again in close attacks.

Fifteen destroyers steaming in line to the assistance of Hood and Renown provided a fine sight. At night the ships of the battle searchlights carried out full calibre firing with their 15-inch guns.

BRAZIL HEAD IS PUT IN OFFICE

Dr. W. L. Pereira de Sousa
Installed at Rio de Janeiro

RIO DE JANEIRO, Nov. 15.—Dr. Washington Luis Pereira de Sousa, former President of the State of Sao Paulo and one of the most eminent political figures of Brazil, became President of the United States of Brazil at noon today, when the new government was inaugurated.

The Brazilian people marked this day as the beginning of a new era of peace and national harmony and the closing of the period of partisan fights which have held sway over Brazil for the past five years, starting a year before the President whose term ended today, Dr. Arthur da Silva Bernardes, took office.

President Bernardes will be known in the history of Brazil as the "father of revolutions" as during his four years of administration the government had to fight an enormous series of revolts and conspiracies instigated by elements of the army which did not support the candidacy of President Bernardes and which perturbed the administration with continued attempts at revolution.

With the exit of President Bernardes from office the motives which the dissatisfied elements thought justified the revolutionaries in the interior of the country will lend their obedience to the new chief of state.

Dr. Washington Luis is a son of the State of Rio de Janeiro, but has built his entire political career in the State of Sao Paulo, where, like Governor Calvin Coolidge here, he gained great fame for his energy in putting down a revolt among the state police.

In Sao Paulo, his administrative work was marked by the extraordinary impulse given the development of roads linking the centre of the state with the capital.

ELECTION UNANIMOUS

The selection of Dr. Washington Luis for the presidency was accepted by all the political parties of the nation and his name was placed on the ballot with no one to contest his election.

It is seen from the speeches and the political platform of the new president that the principal preoccupation of his government will be the financial and currency and the balancing of public finances.

His first move in financial matters will probably be to change the standard of the milreis, which is quoted at 27 pence. It is not yet known what the extent of the change will be, but all indications are that a standard of five pence will be selected, since this is considered the real economic Brazilian milreis.

LONDON, Nov. 15.—The 20,000 blind of England will have an unusual Christmas gift from the nation this year. Broadcasting, which is controlled by the Government, costs every listener in \$2.50 annually, and out of these license fees the company defrays the expenses of daily concerts which can be picked up by cheap crystal sets.

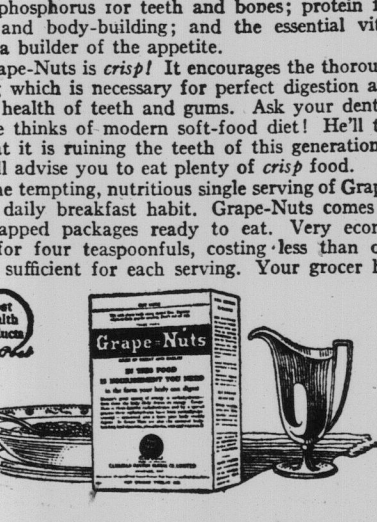
