

## MEXICAN AFTER DEMPSEY FIGHT

Culver City Promoter Trying to Match Fuente and Champion.

Los Angeles, Nov. 8.—Tony Fuente, opposed to Jack Dempsey at Culver City, near here, July 4, 1923, was the proposal made by wire today to Jack Kearns, manager for Dempsey, by Fred Winsor, manager for Fuente, and also manager of the Culver City ring. Winsor sent his telegram to Kearns in New York following the adoption in this state of a by-law to legalize 10-round boxing bouts with decisions, and 12-round bouts without decisions.

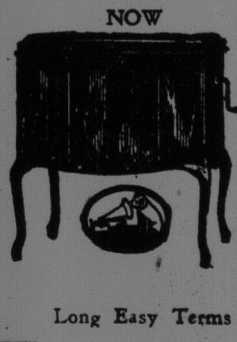

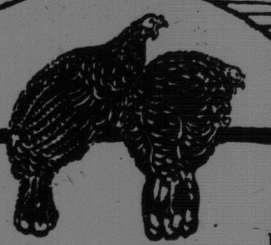

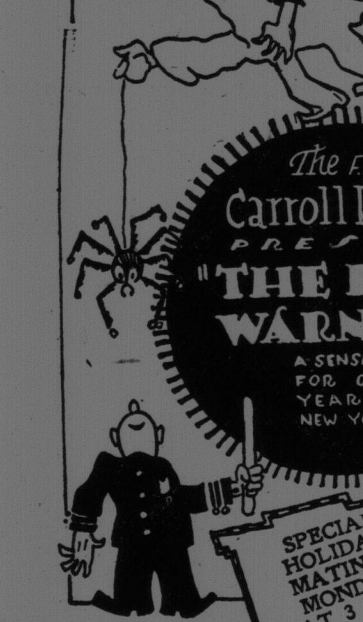
