13 Ministers In By Acclamation

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

Ottawa, Jan. 19.—With thirteen members of the King cabinet returned by acclamation, the decks are cleared for action on Parliament Hill. Important business which must be dealt with before the doors open on the first session of the fifteenth parliament, awaits the attention of the new ministry, and it seems likely that little time will be lost in tackling it. Though the prime minister is not one of the elected it is said that he will devote but little of the country's time to fighting the battle in North York.

Following the close of the official nominations in Newmarket today an invitation was given to Mr. Armstrong or any one representing him to address the meeting called by the premier's supporters.

Newmarket, Ont., Jan. 19.—The names of the prime minister, Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King and J. A. M. Armstrong, ex-member of parliament for North York, were placed in nomination here today for the by-election to be held on February 2. Hon. Mr. King's nomination papers were signed by 125 electors of the riding and those of Mr. Armstrong by about twenty-five electors. Following the close of official nominations the prime minister spoke to a large audience in the town hall.

Chatham, Ont., Jan. 19.—Hon. James M. Murdoch was elected by acclamation this afternoon when their names were the only ones submitted at nomination meetings.

Kingsville, Ont., Jan. 19.—Following a conference of Progressive party leaders here today during the time nominations were open for the South Essex by-election, the decision was announced that there would be no opposition to Hon. G. F. Graham, minister of militia and defence in the King cabinet. The announcement came as a distinct surprise, as it had been the confident expectation of all residents of the riding that the

Progressives would adhere to their decision to place T. J. Willan's name in nomination to oppose the new minister. Montreal, Jan. 19.—Sir Lomer Gouin, minister of justice, Laurier-Ontario; Hon. James Robb, minister of commerce, Huntingdon; Hon. Jacques Bureau, minister of customs and excise, Three Rivers; Hon. E. Lapointe, minister of marine and fisheries, Quebec East; and Hon. B. Land, minister of soldiers' re-establishment, Beauce; presenting themselves to their constituents for re-election after accepting portfolios in Premier King's cabinet, were formally declared elected by acclamation this afternoon when their names were the only ones submitted at nomination meetings.

Holifax, Jan. 19.—No opposition to the election of Hon. W. S. Fielding, minister of finance, in the constituency of Queens-Shedburne, or to Hon. D. D. MacKenzie, solicitor-general of Canada, in Cape Breton North and Victoria, developed in today's nomination proceedings.

Moncton, Jan. 19.—Hon. Arthur Bliss Copp, secretary of state, was today elected to represent Westmorland county in the house of commons. Regina, Jan. 19.—Hon. W. R. Motherwell, minister of agriculture, was returned by acclamation today for the Regina seat.

Ottawa, Jan. 19.—Hon. Charles Murphy, postmaster-general under the Liberal administration, was elected to the seat in Russell county by acclamation. The nomination was held in the town hall at Russell this morning, with a large gathering in attendance and under the presidency of deputy returning officer J. A. Gamble. Hon. Mr. Murphy was present, and delivered a brief address.

VERDICT AGAINST POWER COMPANY

In the case of Cammack versus the New Brunswick Power Company, which has been heard before Judge Crockett in the circuit court, the jury returned a verdict for the plaintiff last evening at 6 o'clock and awarded damages amounting to \$22,113. The case was an action for alleged negligence on the part of the company and arose out of a collision in Donbas Avenue on August 26 between the plaintiff, Frank LeCours, a car driven by the plaintiff. The damages were inflicted on the jury. The case was commenced on Tuesday, D. Mullin, K. C., appeared for the plaintiff and F. R. Taylor, K. C., for the defendant.
