

Numbers Here correspond with numbers in illustration of Thaw's escape in the New York Asylum for the Criminal Insane at Matteawan. Harry Thaw (1) ate breakfast slowly—and (2) went into the parcel room. Greeted by Attendant Buckley, he (8) srolled out into the exercise court, and (4) sauntered around the yard. For a while (5) he stood near the closed gate talking to (6) Attendant Barnum, who (7) opened the gate for a milk wagon. Then Thaw stepped to the opposite side and, as the wagon passed between him and the attendant, slipped out, where (9) two men jumped from an automobile and caught the escaping Thaw and threw him into the auto and flew away (10) at full speed.
