CROSS-EXAMINED BY THE DEFENDING OFFICER

- Q.41. Mr. Wood, on the night of the 16th December, when you put your wallet under your pillow, did you look at the contents?
- A.41. I didn't.
- Q.42. You didn't. Then you could not be sure you had \$43.00 in the wallet at that time?
- A.42. I looked at the contents about supper time and I had that sum of money then.
- Q.43. On the morning of the 17th, who was the first person you noticed in your room?
- A.43. You sir.
- Q.44. How did you notice me -- what brought it to your attention?
- A.44. You woke me up sir.
- Q.45. Did you know you had \$43.00 in your wallet at that time?
- A.45. I coudn't be sure of that sir.
- Q.46. Could anybody else have come in the room between the time you went to bed and the time I woke you up, to your knowledge?
- A.46. It is possible sir.
- Q.47. Was Pte. Lilley in your room when I was there?
- A.47. I don't remember sir.
- Q.48. You don't remember. Exactly what time did you see Pte. Lilley in your room?
- A.48. I don't remember the exact time sir.
- Q.49. Still you remember the exact time of going to the washroom and going to breakfast and returning to the room after breakfast.
- A.49. I remember that because you woke me up and I looked at my watch at that time and found it to be 0730 hours.
- Q.50. When you returned from the washroom at approximately ten minutes to eight did you check your wallet then?
- A.50. I did not sir.
- Q.51. But you saw it there?
- A.51. Yes sir.
- Q.52. Did you really come back from breakfast at five minutes past eight?
- A.52. To the best of my knowledge, yes.
- Q.53. What time did you report to the company office that morn-ing?
- A.53. About ten o'clock.
- Q.54. The first time?
