A Prize of the value of Ten Dollars in Books, will be given to the Candidate who, at any of the four examinations of Undergraduates, has been placed first in the First Class in Oriental Languages.

Prizes, each of the value of Ten Dollars in Books, may be awarded annually among Undergraduates in Law, Medicine, or Arts, for the best Compositions in Greek Verse, Greek Prose, Latin Verse, Latin Prose, English Verse, English Prose, French Prose, and German Prose.

Certificates of Honor will be given at each Examination to those Students who have been placed in the First Class in any Department.
