

The Government deserves much credit for the prompt and judicious measures they adopted for the relief of the sufferers.

ESTIMATE OF LOSSES At present the loss by this storm is estimated at £50,000 to £60,000, or \$200,-000 to \$240,000. Most of the vessels are insured in a Mutual Insurance club; but when a disaster of this kind occurs, there might almost as well be no insurance, as insurance is paid out in covering losses. The loss of so many fishing vessels will seriously interfere with fishing operations next year, though many new vessels may be built during the winter, and thus employment be afforded.
