This vessel was launched June 27 of this year at Greenock, and is the first vessel the Donaldson Line have had built especially for the passenger trade. Hitherto the Athenian, which was fitted for second and third class accommodation, has been their only passenger steamer. However, the success attending the work of that vessel was so marked that the firm decided to extend this branch of their business. She will carry only second and third class passengers, though the second class will have all the best parts of the ship, and the accommodation usually reserved for the first class.

The Cassandra is a twin-screw steamer, 455 feet in length, 53 feet in breadth, 40 ft. in depth to shelter deck, and of 8,000 tons gross. Accommodation is provided for 200 second class passengers on the shelter, bridge and boat decks, while 1,000 third class passengers on the shelter, bridge and boat decks, while 1,000 third class passengers can be accommodated.

While the vessel is primarily intended for passengers, she is also very completely equipped for the carrying 9,00 tons of deadweight. The loading and discharging apparatus are of the most modern and approved style. This vessel will carry frozen meat and dairy produce from Canada to Scotland, and a large refrigerating chamber has been fitted up.
