UNION MEN DECIDE TO ACCEPT RECOMMENDATIONS

Reach Decision at General Meeting of Union, Yesterday Afternoon—Attitude of Shipping Companies to Schedule not Known Last Evening—A General Increase.

At a special meeting of the 'Longshoremen's Union, held yesterday afternoon, it was decided to accept the recommendation of the Board of Conciliation appointed to deal with the dispute between the shipping companies and the representatives of the union.

It was not known in the city last evening whether the shipping companies had decided to accept the recommendations, but it was said there was little doubt that they would.

W. E. Foster, chairman of the board, said last night that while the recommendations were not legally binding, they were morally so, as during the proceedings the Conciliation Board had practically been converted into an Arbitration Board.

The report of the board composed of W. E. Foster, chairman, John E. Moore, representing the shipping interests, and J. E. Tighe, representing the longshoremen, was unanimous.

The report of the board made to the Minister of Labor was as follows: St. John, N. B., Nov. 12th, 1913. In the matter of the Industrial Disputes Investigation Act, 1907, and in the matter of the dispute between the longshoremen of the Port of Saint John, Employees, and

THE BOARD RECOMMENDS THAT THE MEN BE PAID AS FOLLOWS:

- (1) The hours shall constitute a day's or night's work from November 15th to April 30th inclusive, and 9 hours shall constitute a day's or night's work from May 1st to November 15th. (2) Double time to be paid for meal hours, and over time at the prevailing rate of wages.
