## MARKET FOR ANGLO-FRENCH BONDS IS SOUND

\$3,000,000 Worth Sold by One Banker without Market Price Varying Fraction of Point.

New York, Aug. 31.—As an indication of the inherent strength in the market for Anglo-French bonds, an officer of one of the largest national banks in this city told today of having disposed of \$2,000,000 worth on one day for a customer without the market price of the security moving a fraction of a point. This same banker said he held recently for another customer \$1,000,000 worth of the American Foreign Securities Company's French government notes and that the offering caused no variation of the price. Of course in both cases the brokers did not offer to sell the entire block of bonds in bulk, but distributed the order into smaller denominations. The fact that the bonds were sold at the prevailing price serves to illustrate the sound market condition for these securities.

Clearing Up of Iron Pfd. Dividends Followed by Placing Price Brs. on 6 p. c. Basis

Montreal, Aug. 31.—Yesterday the iron directors declared all back dividends on the preferred stock and today Price Bros. was put on a 6 per cent. basis, showing the wonderful prosperity the iron and paper business is enjoying today. There was a better feeling in the market due to the clearing up of the iron and paper business in regard to the strike. At the close, however, the latest news was not as cheerful as the earlier reports. Steamships sold up to 31 1/2, a new high for this stock, and the preferred was in good demand at 36 1/2 to 36 3/4. Laurendeau was better at 185, and on light sales sold up to 127 3/4. There has been a good demand for this stock for some time. Clive was better at 79 1/2. Iron and Steel of Canada both active and firmer. It looks as if fluctuations would be erratic until we hear some definite news in regard to the strike.
