LONDON, Aug. 5. Consols 92½. Bullion paid into Bank of England to-day £38,000. Breadstuffs quiet. Conservatives have won a triumph at Greenwich by electing Mr. Boscawen, a London distiller, to Parliament vice David Salomons deceased. It is stated on good authority that Gladstone will not seek re-election, but contemplates returning to private life.

NEW YORK, Aug. 6. Letters from the Governor of the Argentine Republic to the United States of Columbia on intervention on behalf of Cuba, are received. Nearly all South American Republics have offered their friendly services in like manner. The enthusiasm in Peru over the Cuban question is intense, and it is reported that a loan of twenty millions is to be issued in that country on behalf of Cuba.

LONDON, Aug. 6. PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS. The election to fill the vacancy in the Commons from Dundee resulted in the election of James Yea, a Liberal. The election from East Staffordshire took place to-day. The result is not yet known. The betting is strong in favor of the Conservative, Allsopp.

A DUEL. Was fought to-day between M. Herve, editor of the Journal de Paris, and Edmond About, the well-known author. The latter was slightly wounded in the right hand.

DEATH OF A STATESMAN. Odillon Barrot Vice President of the Council of State, died to-day, aged 82.

THE CIVIL WAR IN SPAIN. The Government is concentrating a large force of gendarmes in Madrid to disarm the disaffected militia battalions.

The German Consul at Almeria claims \$50,000 damages for the injury done to his residence during the bombardment by the insurgent men-of-war.

The Government troops have re-occupied Corda.

The insurgents have gained possession of Orhuela and threaten Alicante.

The Government troops have advanced 600 yards into Valencia, the insurgents making an obstinate resistance.

The insurgent force, having landed a detachment at Matril. All the Government funds were seized and \$48,000 levied.
