Dr J. R. Battisby, the convener of the Committee, presented the report, showing that the sum of two hundred and twenty six dollars and thirty cents (\$226.30) had been paid to the Rev. Wm. King as directed by Synod, and that the books had been regularly audited and found correct. On motion the report was received and adopted, the thanks of the Synod tendered the committee and convener for their diligence, and the members of the committee reappointed for the ensuing year.
