TREATMENT OF PNEUMONIA.— G. Ivanoff (Bulgarian Meditzina), senior physician to the Lom Hospital, says that he most successfully treats croupous pneumonia by the internal use of camphor with antipyrin (B. Camph. pulver. o. 5 gramme; antipyrine. 2.0; morph. hydrochlor. 0.02; sacch. qs. M. f. pulv. One-fourth to be given every one or two hours). In adynamic cases he simultaneously resorts to hypodermic injections of camphor in the dose of from 0.05 to 0.1 g., three or four times a day, for which purpose he employs a fatty solution (0.5 camphor to 0.1 g. olive oil). The writer reports a series of twenty-two cases treated consecutively by this method at the hospital during the period December 10, 1893, to March 25, 1894. All of them were

rather severe, but nevertheless every one ended in recovery. The hospital registers for 1889 to December, 1893, show that, previously to the introduction of the treatment, from three to seven patients succumbed to the disease every year, the yearly number of pneumonia cases admitted oscillating between twenty and thirty.—
