ARSITY or Tigers for the Canadian championship?" " asks the writer of an inter-esting article in a recent issue of the

Course and wisely goes on to refer to Quebec and Ontario as that part of Canada "which arrogates to itself most Canadian championships."

Sectionalism may prompt the ques-tion, but why should these annual contests between the respective wincontests between the respective win-ners in rival senior football unions in Ontario and Quebec be looked upon as having the right to settle the "Can-adian championship?" Just as fairly might the Dalhousie College team of Halifax claim the title. Perhaps its right to the honour might be even stronger since the college heap enter stronger since the college has sent out the best team in three provinces and since the style of game which is play-ed by its team is of much longer standing than that followed in Upper Canada.

However, under existing circum-stances the claiming of the champion-ship by a Quebec or an Ontario team makes little difference to anyone out-side of those provinces, just as a sim-ilar claim by one of the English Rug-by teams of the far east or the far west would not affect the people of the provinces in which the Canadian Rugby game is played.
