### **Some New Officers in Staff Positions At Borden RCAF Station**

A number of staff changes have taken place recently at No. 1 Service Flying Training School, RCAF, Camp Borden, replacing officers who have been posted to other stations.

The new Chief Flying Instructor is Squadron Leader A. J. Vincent of Toronto. S/L Vincent has had lengthy flying experience in the RCAF and was at Camp Borden as an instructor in the early part of the war. His wife and family are residing at Big Bay Point for the summer.

The new adjutant is Flight Lieutenant A. W. Rogers, who was posted to No. 1 SFTS from No. 20 EFTS, Oshawa, where he held a similar position. A veteran of the last war, F/L Rogers went overseas in the early days with a Toronto regiment and won the Military Medal with the 1st Canadian Mounted Rifles. He transferred later to the Royal Flying Corps and saw action as an observer. In civilian life he was with the Bell Telephone Co. His family reside in Cobourg at present. F/L Rogers joined the RCAF in 1940 and after taking the administrative course at Trenton served on that station for two years. Later he was adjutant at the RCAF Construction and Maintenance Unit in Toronto, before posting to Oshawa.

Squadron Leader W. Cunningham, recently returned from overseas, is the new head of Servicing Squadron. An aeronautical engineer, his home is in Cornwall.

The new Protestant chaplain is Flight Lieutenant D. R. L. Clarke, who was posted to No. 1 SFTS from No. 1 ITS, Toronto Eglinton. His home is in Brantford and he is an Anglican minister.

The new Roman Catholic chaplain is Flight Lieutenant W. L. Gavad, whose home is in Thorold. He came to No. 1 SFTS from No. 5 SFTS, Brantford.

Section Officer J. B. McGillivray of the Women's Division came to No. 1 SFTS from the RCAF Convalescent Hospital, Beaumaris, Muskoka. She is acting as assistant adjutant.
