Years ago, in the  
lucky turn experts who see in the  
public clamor for the Hoots colt  
many of the possibilities which  
brought destiny to Old Rosebud.  
Not since 1914, when Old Rose-  
bud won the Kentucky Derby and set  
the record for the race at 2:03 2-8,  
has there been a racer held so high  
in public esteem. Lovers of horse-  
flesh are showering their affections  
on this black son of Black Tony and  
the little Indian pony, Useelt.  
Old Rosebud, after winning the  
Derby in 1914, was sent east and  
broke down during a race at Bel-  
mont. His owners sent him to Texas  
and three years later he came back  
and beat Roamer and other lead-  
ers. He was so popular he was  
"traced to death" and was destroyed  
two years ago.  
For several years no horse re-  
ceived the admiration that was Old  
Rosebud's. Black Gold made a bid  
for it last winter when he won the  
Louisiana Derby at New Orleans. He
