

and the instruction given the Indians in farming should be changed with the least possible delay, so far as the Indians under Treaties 4 and 6 are concerned; and as respects those interested in Treaty 7, a similar change should be made as soon as it is practicable to do so. The Supt General also authorizes all the Instructors at present employed being notified that, after a certain date, their services will not be required. The Supt General further directs that competent and reliable men should be engaged at a monthly salary; and should find themselves, - one of whom should reside upon each Reserve to instruct the Indians by superintending
