I have the honour to inform you that this Department has been advised that there is a section of government land, distant some two miles from the town of Medicine Hat, in Alberta, and across the river, which was some twenty years ago used by your Force, now lying idle. If this section is available the Department has under contemplation the using of it as a camping ground on which to collect the vagrant or straggling Indians, who are hanging about Medicine Hat and Maple Creek, and formerly followed Chief Frontman in the Fort Walsh neighbourhood.

I will therefore be glad to learn whether you have any further use for the section or objection to its being transferred to this Department for its purposes.
