Ottawa, May 2, 1910.


Sir,

As you are aware the Department paid the full salary to the teachers of the Eastern and Central Tyendinaga schools from January 1, 1909, to December 31, 1909, pending the settlement of the dispute between the Council of the Band and the whites resident upon the reserve as to the contribution to be made by each of the parties towards the maintenance of the schools.

The salary paid for the four quarters to the teacher of the Eastern school was \$350.00, and there is, therefore, on this account a refund of \$175.00 to be made.

At the Central school the sum of \$87.50 was paid for each of the March and June quarters and \$22.06, being the balance due the teacher, who was resigning, for the year. The new teacher was only paid \$50.00 for the September quarter and \$75.00 for the December quarter, making a total payment of \$322.06. The refund on this account is, therefore, \$161.03. These amounts should be transmitted by you to be placed to the credit of the band.
