Sir-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 4th Instant, with enclosures, regarding the issue of Location Tickets to Sampson and William G. Simon for portions of the land held by their father, the late John Simon, under Location Ticket No 69, and in reply have to request you to be good enough to favour me with a report in this matter. It will be necessary for you to state date of death of John Simon, whether or not he died intestate, what heirs, if any, he left. In view of the fact that this land had been located to John Simon, it would be unnecessary for the Band to re-locate it, unless owing to failure of heirs, it reverted to the Band, as the Indian Act makes provision for the disposal of all lands held by Indians.

Upon receipt of your report, this matter will be given due consideration.
