
Ottawa, April 3, 1915.

Sir,-

In view of the report contained in your letter of the 29th ultimo, regarding the case of Daniel Bernard, who is ill with consumption, I beg to say that relief supplies, to the value of \$2.00 a week, may be furnished this man as long as he requires the assistance.

You should make further report with regard to this case and state whether the doctor has any recommendation to make with a view to preventing the other members of the family contracting the disease from which Bernard is suffering. You should report as to the size of the house in which this family is living and what can best be done. In some cases the Department has provided a tent for the patient. Such action might be taken in this case if the doctor considered it advisable.
