



Ottawa, December 7th., 1915.

Sir,-

I beg to inform you that an Indian named, Denis Paul, who belongs to Kings County, N. S. has deserted his wife and family, which consists of two small children. Mr. Beckwith, the Indian Agent for Kings County has informed the Department that he learned from the Indian's wife that the man is now at Shubenacadie, having recently gone to that place from New Brunswick. The Department desires that you will endeavour to locate him. If you find him you should inform him that the Department expects him to support his wife and children. You should also endeavour to make his duty clear to him. If he will not undertake to look after them you should give him to understand that steps will be taken to compel him to support his family. You should make a full report to the Department after you have carried out the foregoing instructions.
