- Q. To distribute?
- A. Yes, to distribute. Sometimes it would be six or seven prunes each; maybe more.

## CROSS-EXAMINED BY THE PROSECUTOR

- Q. Cpl. Willis, these marches you refer to as being in the spring and summer; do you know of any marches within the camp earlier when there was still snow on the ground?
- A. No, I can't recall them, sir.
- Q. You weren't present on any when you marched up and down the parade square in the snow?
- A. No, sir.
- q. What sort of songs did you sing on the march?
- A. We sang "It's a Long, Long Way to Tipperary", "Carry Me Back to Dear Old Blighty"--something like that--and several of our own Army songs. And also, on one or two occasions we sang a song that Sgt. Harvey had written himself.
- Q. Do you know that song?
- A. No, I don't, sir. I don't believe anybody did.
- Q. Was it in English or a Japanese song?
- A. In English, sir.
- e. In English?
- A. Yes, sir.
- Q. Do you remember the words?
- A. Yes, sir.
- Q. What were the words?
- oh, no; I don't know, sir. I don't know the words myself, sir. We used to -I can't even remember what the tune was. It was written to the tune of our own songs, and nobody did get the words down pat.
- Q. To the tune of "Carry Me Back to Dear Old Blighty"?
- A. I think so.
- Q. Do you remember any of the lines?
- A. There was something about cherry blossoms or something.
- Q. Do you remember a line, something about "On To Singapore."
- A. No, sir.
- q. You told the Court something of the setting up of this committee-judiciary committee?
- A. Yes, sir.
