profession. And in matters which depend upon the law of evidence strictly regarded, the increasing scope of codifying statutes, such as the Criminal Evidence Act, 1898, made it more convenient to re-write those passages which are affected by these statutes.

Finally, I have added a chapter on some elementary rules of evidence, in the belief that a list of such rules, especially if it be short, may be of use to the beginner in advocacy.
