We have translated these rates into the same terms for each country and while in most cases they are exact, in some they are only approximate.

By the unfairness of these rates \$31,000,000 circulates amongst American farmers instead of amongst Canadian farmers. Imagine what a difference if our farmers had this extra \$31,000,000 every year to spend in Canada. It would keep Canadian factories going and would keep Canadian workmen employed, and this would still further add to the farmers' market. There were 300,000 farmers' customers driven out of Canada in 1923 by lowering the tariff and the American tariff now stands between those customers and our farmers.
