FARNHAM.

The town of Farnham is situated on the southern branch of the Yamaska River. The place owes its origin to the excellent water power, which the rapid fall of the stream at this point provides. Incorporated as a village in 1861, Farnham subsequently became a town in 1876. Of late years the place has very much improved, and many of its buildings are of a superior not to say imposing character. By the last assessment valuation, the rateable property amounts to \$356,750.00, while the non-rateable public property reaches a further sum of \$300,000.00. The population is somewhat variable, but stands at present at 2,500. The following railroads pass through the place: Canadian Pacific, Central Vermont, Montreal, Portland & Boston, (including the South Eastern and Lake Champlain & St. Lawrence Junction). By the junction of these roads, Farnham has connection with every town and village in its vicinity, and with all parts of the surrounding country. The Circuit Court meets every four months. There are three mails a day to and from Montreal. Mails are here made up for l'Ange Gardien, Abbotsford, St. Pie, Haseville, Stanbury, M. J. Ashton. Within the limits of the town are 3 saw mills, 2 grist mills, 2 furniture, sash and door factories, 1 tub factory, 1 woollen and carding factory, and a sugar refinery. The South Eastern Railway also has large repair shops in the place. Saturday is the special market day. The Roman Catholics have a large convent and the College of the Holy Cross. The Protestants possess a graded school with very efficient teachers. There is a very excellent Hospital under the Grey Nuns. The Church of Rome, the Church of England, the Presbyterian Church and the Methodist Church have each well appointed places of worship under the care of resident clergymen. Farnham is distant from St. Johns, 14 miles; from Dunham, 16 miles; from Cowansville, 15 miles; from Bedford, 12 miles; from Granby, 15 miles; from St. Casaire, 9 miles; from Marieville, 15 miles; from Chambly, 20 miles; from A. Lamsville, 11 miles; from Brigham, 7 miles, and from Montreal, 49 miles.
