THE QUEEN.

Her Majesty VICTORIA, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India (in India, Kaisar-i-Hind), born 24th May, 1819; succeeded to the Throne 20th June, 1837, on the death of her uncle King William IV.; crowned 28th June, 1838; and married, 10th February, 1840, to his late Royal Highness Francis Albert Augustus Charles Emmanuel, Prince Consort, Duke of Saxony, Prince of Coburg and Gotha.

THE PRINCE AND PRINCESS OF WALES.

His Royal Highness ALBERT EDWARD, Prince of Wales, Duke of Saxony, Cornwall and Rothesay, Earl of Dublin, &c., born 9th November, 1841; married 10th March, 1863, to the Princess ALEXANDRA Caroline Mary Charlotte Louisa Julia (born 1st December, 1844), eldest daughter of the King of Denmark.

THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL AND STAFF.

Governor-General.—His Excellency the Most Honourable HENRY CHARLES KEITH PETTY-FITZMAURICE, Marquis of Lansdowne, G.C.M.G., &c., &c. Born, January 14th, 1845; educated at Eton and Balliol College, Oxford; married, 1869, the LADY MAUD EVELYN HAMILTON, youngest daughter of the First Duke of Abercorn, K.G. Was a Commissioner of Exchequer of Great Britain and of Treasury of Ireland 1868-72, when he was appointed Under-Secretary of State for War. Appointed Governor-General of Canada, 18th Aug., 1883.
