HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion ands in Manitoba or the North-west Territories, excepting 8 and 56, which has not been homesteaded, or reserved to provide wood toots for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sode head of a family, or any male over 18 years of ago, to the extent of one-quarter section of 100 acres, more or less.

Entry may be made personally at the loca land office for the District in which the land to be taken in situate, or if the homesteader desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the Local Agent for the district in which the land is situate, receive authority for some one to make entry for him. A fee of \$10 is charged for a homestead entry

HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto to perform the conditions connected herewith, under one of the following plans:—

At least six months' residence upon and addition of the land in each year during the erm of three years.

(2) If the father for mother, if the father is decascal) or any penon who is eligible to make a homested entry upon the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a house-stead, the requirements of this Act as to us-sidence prior to obtaining pasent may be estisted by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If h settler has obtained a patent for his homestead, or a certificate for the issue of such patent countersigned in themanner prescribed by this Act, and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same township or an adjoining or cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2)(3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock with buildings for their accommedation, and have besides 90 acres substantially fenced.

Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homesteader law is lable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

Should be made at the end of the three years before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homesteal Inspector, Fedore making applica-tion for patent the better must give six months notice in writing the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of his intention to
