Automatic Whistle Buoy off Liverpool, Nova Scotia.

Notice is hereby given that an Automatic Whistle Buoy has been placed off Liverpool, Nova Scotia.

The Buoy which is intended as a Fair way buoy, is colored black and white in vertical stripes. It is mounted on 2 1/2 fathoms of water and from N. 30° East Island Light bears N. 30° E. distant 1 1/2 miles. From Point Lighthouse the buoy of the trees on the Western Head bears W. 1/2 N. distant 2 1/2 miles.

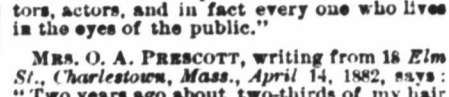
