XXXVI. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That immediately after any Act shall be passed by the Common Council, it Acts of the Common shall be signed by the Mayor, and sealed with the Seal of the Corporation, the Mayor, sealed and entrolled; and enrolled; and such Act shall thenceforth go into effect, as a law of the Town of Kingston; and all such laws, together with this Act, and all other Acts of Parliament particularly relating to the said Town, shall be entered, verbatim, in a book to be kept by the Clerk, and signed by the Mayor, and be open to the public for inspection, between the hours And open to inspection. of eleven of the clock, A. M. and two of the clock, P. M. on payment to the Clerk of three pence, and no more, for every examination.

XXXVII. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That Nectings of Common the Council shall meet on the first Monday of every month, in each year, Council at the least.

XXXVIII. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That Authority of Common it shall be lawful for the Mayor and Common Council of the Town of Council in respect to Kingston, to regulate and license owners of Livery Stables, and to regulate and license the owners and keepers of Hackney Coaches, and of Horse Phætons, Chairs, Sleighs, Sleds, Waggons, Carts, and Carriages of every description, used for hire or reward in the said Town.

XXXIX. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That in suits where Corporatupon the trial of any issue, or upon the taking or making of any inqui-interested, inhabitants &c. sition, or upon the judicial investigation of any fact whatsoever, to which witnesses or Jurons; issue, inquest or investigation, the said Town, or the Mayor, Aldermen and Common Council-men thereof, or either of them, are a party, or in which they are interested, no person shall be deemed an incompetent Witness or Juror, by reason of his being an Inhabitant Freeholder or Freeman of the said Town; and if any person shall be sued or impleaded This Act may be given in by reason of any thing done by virtue of this Act, it shall be lawful for issue. such person to plead the general issue, and to give this Act and the special matter in evidence at the trial.

XL. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That it Common Council may shall and may be lawful for the said Common Council, from time to time appoint Board of Health. to appoint so many of the members thereof as shall be thought necessary to form a Board of Health, to aid and assist the Mayor of the said Town to carry into effect the provisions of the Statutes which now are, or may be passed, to preserve the health of the said Town, and to prevent the introduction and spreading of infectious and pestilential diseases in the same; and the said Board, in conjunction with the Mayor, shall have the like power and authority for the purposes aforesaid, as are vested in
