By-Preducts of Lumber.

Thanks to the activities of the Unit ed States department of agriculture, and especially the forest products lab oratory, ways have been revealed by which well nigh every scrap of a tree can be put to good account, and the waste material of one plant or factory can be utilized gainfully in the manufacture of commodities turned out by others, says the Scientific American.
Through the makinm of the woodwests exchange which is being done to
product lumber, but the practice is relatively only in its infancy with us. Finally it should be kept in mind that the alcehol that can be made from sawdust is chemically identical with grain alcohol, and therefore valuable for many industrial purposes.
