PROGRESS OF THE WAR

[September 14 to September 20] The past week has been a momentous one, both in active hostilities and in regard to developments in the Balkan States.

In the Western theatre fierce artillery duels were continuous throughout the week over most of the front; and at the extreme west the land operations of the Allies were assisted by the bombardment of Ostend and other Belgian coasts by the British fleet.

In the Eastern theatre the Russian drive into Russian territory south of Riga, the fortified town of Vilna was abandoned to them, and at the close of the week 30,000 Russians were in great jeopardy of being surrounded and cut off from the main army.

Rev. E. B. Hooper, Chaplain with the 26th Regiment, in a letter to a friend in St. John, which was printed in the Telegram on Monday, tells of the review by King George V and Earl Kitchener of the 2nd Canadian Division at Beachborough Park, Kent, on September 2.

SENT BACK TO AMHERST Under a guard from the garrison artillery stationed on Partridge Island, the four German prisoners who were captured near Chance Harbor on Tuesday, Sept. 14, were taken back to Amherst from St. John on 15th.

Whether conscription is to be introduced in Great Britain or not, appears to be a question on which even the Cabinet is divided. This much may be premised that if the voluntary system at Home gives place to conscription, conscription must follow in the great self-governing Dominions. This is a most serious matter for the consideration of all Canadians.

RECRUITING

CONSIDERABLE activity is being displayed in many parts of New Brunswick in recruiting men for overseas service. The percentage of enlistments in the Maritime Provinces is still below that of the Western Provinces of the Dominion, a condition of affairs that is not at all surprising.

Concerning the four captured Germans who had escaped from Amherst, a Joggins Mines letter says: "The stranger seen at the head of the River Hebert a few days ago and suspected of being one of the four Germans who recently escaped from the internment camp at Amherst is believed to have stolen a boat and oars at Shulee the other evening and to have attempted to cross the bay to the New Brunswick side."
