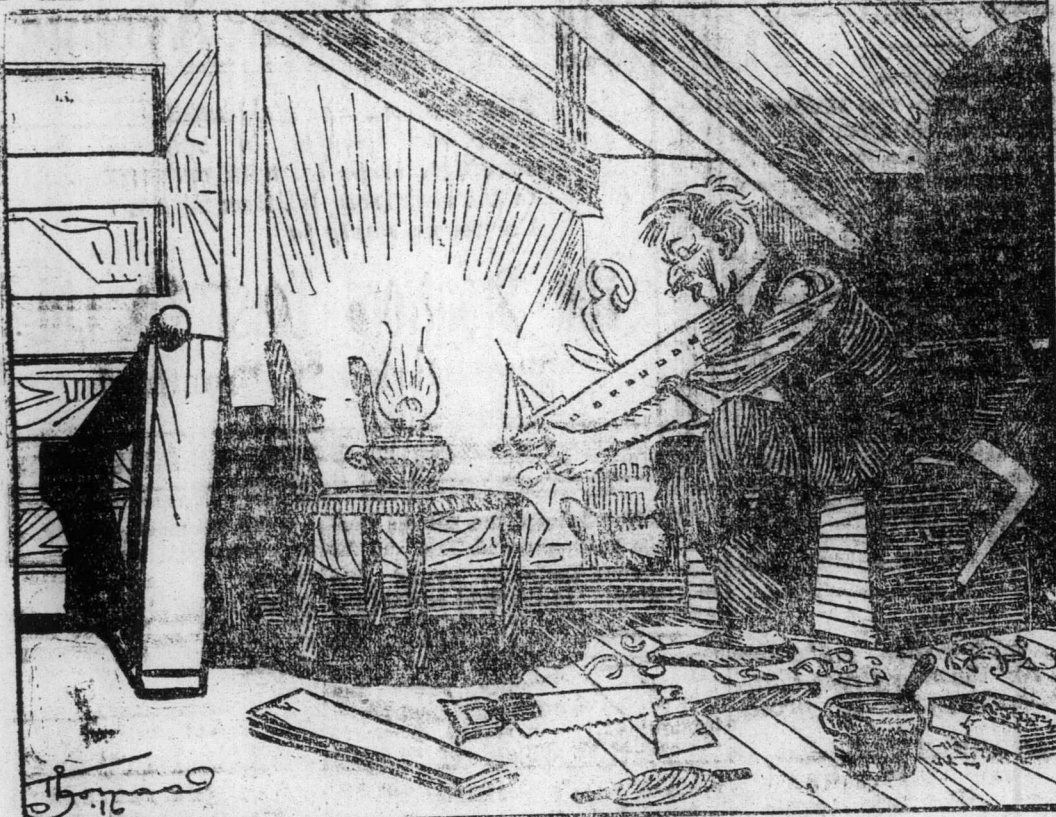

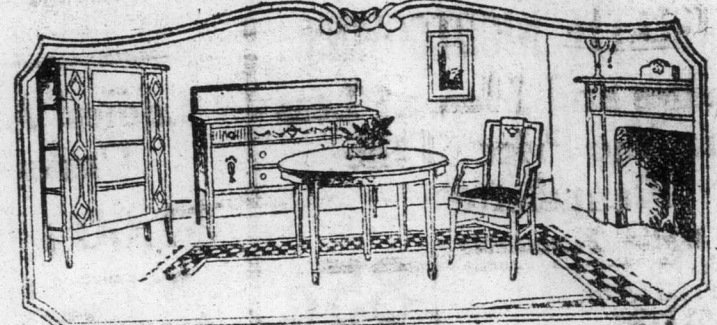
No Nurses Lost on Britannic; Members of Crew Only Perished.

THE STORY

Of the Destruction of the Ship, Told by Matron.

By Courier Leased Wire. Athens, Wednesday, Nov. 22.—Via London, Nov. 24.—11.25 a.m.—(Delayed)—All of the nurses on the Britannic were saved as far as is known. Those who were drowned were stokers and engineers. London, Nov. 24.—(Montreal Gazette)—The Daily Chronicle's Athens correspondent quotes the matron of the Britannic, Miss E. A. Dowse, who carries many war medals on her uniform—she went through the siege of Ladysmith—as follows: "The ship had all the hospital marks and was fitted up like the best British hospital. It is impossible to understand why the ship was attacked. We were bound for Mudros and everything to take the sick aboard there. I had with me seventy-six nursing sisters, mostly belonging to Queen Alexandra's nursing staff, together with five stewesses. They were all English, and happily were saved. We had no patients aboard, excepting a few of the staff who were slightly ill. We were able to carry them on deck and get them away. "The explosion occurred when we were at breakfast. We heard something, but had no idea the ship had been hit or was going down. With- out alarm we went on deck and awaited the launching of the boats. The whole staff behaved most splendidly, waiting calmly lined up on the deck. We were two hours in the boats. The Germans, however, could not have chosen a better time for giving us an opportunity to save those aboard, for we had all risen. We were near land and the sea was perfectly smooth."

Hospital Ship Sunk; All Saved

London, Nov. 24, 1 p.m.—The British hospital ship Braemar Castle, of 6,290 tons gross, bound from Saloniki to Malta with wounded, has been mined or torpedoed in the Aegean Sea. It was officially announced today. All on board were saved. The disaster occurred in the Mykonos channel, the announced location. Mykonos is an island in the Aegean, distant about 100 miles from Piraeus, the port of Athens. A comparatively narrow passage separates Mykonos from the island of Tino, to the northwest.
