The estimated requirement for the .2nd year of, the Fund is \$7,500,000 or say \$1 per head. The Maritime Provinces have assessed themselves, \$550,000 or 61c per capita. If we are to bear our share Kings County will have to contribute another \$13,000 to the Central Fund. It may be asked "why should we contribute more than is necessary to support our own dependents. But the Fund is not local, it is National in character and scope, and there are Counties and Provinces not so inch as we that have sent more than their quota of recruits. It is required of us if we cannot fight to give generously of our resources. In other words, "Fight or Pay."
