

But the result is most significant in the prominence and clearness which it gives to the facts that the waisuse of trust funds is apt to be a crime—that is not merely negligence, with a liability to respond to the injured party in pecuniary damages, but a violation of the criminal law, exposing the offender to the real horrors of prison life.
