JAPS ALMOST CERTAIN OF VICTORY.

Opinions of Experts.

New York, April 12—A London despatch to the World says:—Rear Admiral Gayles, a distinguished naval strategist and expert, writes in the London Itality Telegraph: "We may expect that the whole passage of the Russian fleet to the north through the China Sea will be marked by continual harrassing by Japanese torpedo boat destroyers, whose supreme object will be to wear down the Russian fleet ship by ship, and when the supreme moment arrives for action between the battle fleets, if such an event should take place, Admiral Togo's superiority may even be greater than at present. It is probable that there will be little occurring in the way of a naval action while the Russians are so close to territorial.

CLEVELAND, Ohio, April 12—Before leaving for the east yesterday, Commander Booth Tucker, who with Rider Haggart, the author, is making an inspection of the social colony work done by the Salvation Army to relieve congestion in population in London by sending persons to Canada and other English colonies. He said:

"Last year the Salvation Army carried 10,000 persons from England to Canada, which is starving for population. We carried them in our own ship. It will not be long before we shall be carrying Englishmen, not by thousands, but by tens of thousands, not only to Canada but to New Zealand, Australia, India and South Antirea. We did not dump our implements in Quebec, as the United States government dumps them at Ellis Island, but dropped six here and eight there and a dozen in another place where ever they were needed. Every man who left England for Canada knew before, he started where he was going, what he was going to receive. The Usted States should revise its immigration laws. Through its consuls and other representatives, immigrants should be investigated before they start. Then you could get the best of Europe, the yeomanry, the healthy, sturdy stock, and not the ne'er-do-well. The Salvation Army would like to co-operate with the United States government in a work of this kind. Then colonization could be made the handmaid of immigration."
