ALL persons residing in Canada, employed in Canada, or carrying on business in Canada, are liable to a tax on income, as follows:--

1. Every unmarried person, or widow, or widower, without dependants as defined by the Act, who during the calendar year 1919 received or earned \$1,000 or more.

2. All other individuals who during the calendar year 1919 received or earned \$2,000 or

3. Every corporation and joint stock company whose profits exceeded \$2,000 during the fiscal year ended in 1919.

Penalty

Every person required to make a return, who fails to do so within the time limit, shall be subject to a penalty of Twenty-five per centum of the amount of the tax payable.

Any person, whether taxable, or otherwise making a false statement in any return or in any information required by the Minister, shall not exceeding \$18,000 or to six months' imprise

Prosecution Shows Accused in Trouble Regarding Finances

BUFFALO, April 15-The defense in the case of John Edward Teiper accused of murdering his mother and brother to improve his finane, will not open in the supreme court until Monday. Justice Harry L. Taylor made this annoucement at 3.30 o'clock yesterday afternoon at which time he granted a motion for acjournment until this morning. The motion was made by District Attorney Guy B. Moore.

In granting the motion Justice Tavfor addressed the jury as followsf

"Gentlemen, the prosecution will complete its case tomorrow, probably in the morning, When it is completed the court will adjourn until Monday. This will give the defense an opportunity to prepare for the opening of court, therfore, on Friday and none! of us will object to the rest, I am

There had been a long conference earlier in the afternoon at which time Mr. Moore explained that he would be unable to complete his case by 5 o'clock. He suggested his motion for actournmeent and George Clinton, Sr., chief of counsel for the defense said he would not opose it. In return Mr. Clinton requested thtat the de-



fense be permitted to opene its case on Monday.

Point for Prosecution

The prosecution scored yesterday through the testimony of Dr. Edwarl J. Meyer, consulting surgeon to all but one of Buffalo's hospitals, and Joseph C. Whitwell, finer print expert of the Buffalo police deepartment.

Dr. Meyer testified that it was not probable that the defendant was rendered unconscious by the blow he was struck on the night his mother and brother was murdered. The defence has claimed that Teiper was knocked senseless after seeing his brother fall and knew nothing of the fate of his. nother, sister and brother until he regained consdiousness flome time later. Teiper alleged that highwaymen it was one of the highwaymen who attacked him.
